Distinguished Contribution to International Education

Awardee

Professor Chris Ziguras, School of Global, Urban and Social Studies, RMIT University

Professor Chris Ziguras is a leading authority on the social, economic and political dimensions of the internationalisation of education. This interest is carried across his higher education leadership and management roles at RMIT, his prominent research on cross-border higher education, his teaching in international development and public policy, and his active public engagement. Chris has also been a Board Member, Vice President and past President of IEAA.

Excellence in Leadership in International Education

Awardee

Derek Scott, Principal, Haileybury

Derek is one of Australia's most highly regarded education leaders. He is on the Federal Government's International Education Council, the Victorian Government's International Education Expert Advisory Group and is the Chair of the Associated Public Schools of Victoria and the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority. In 2021, he was on the panel of four experts conducting a review of Initial Teacher Education in Australia. He has been Principal of Haileybury since 2007.

Excellence in Professional Commentary Related to International Education

Awardee

Jon Chew, Global Head of Insights and Analytics, Navitas

Jon Chew significantly contributes to public debate and discussion as one of Australia's foremost experts in international education market trends. He regularly presents his research at AIEC and international conferences held by NAFSA, EAIE, APAIE and CBIE, and his comments can be found in international education publications, including The PIE News, ICEF Monitor and Times Higher Education. Jon is highly sought-after as an international education commentator in Australia and globally.

'Study Australia International Education Program'

The Study Australia Industry Experience Program (SAIEP) is a national, flagship digital industry project program to engage international students with Australian employers – providing authentic professional experience, skills & connections for students. SAIEP is a Study Australia Partnership (SAP) Project; a joint collaboration between the Australian Government, all State and Territory Government IET destination agencies, and EdTech delivery partner Practera.

Tony Adams Rising Star Award

Awardee

Eloise Dolan, Program Manager and Generation Asia Lead, Asia Society Australia

Eloise Dolan is an early-career professional whose work straddles international education and global affairs. She has worked as Program Manager for Asia Society Australia (ASA) since 2019, where she drives the design and delivery of ASA's Victoria-based programming. Eloise also leads ASA's 'Generation Asia' pillar, spotlighting younger voices in Australia-Asia engagement. In 2021, Eloise was named a 'Young Woman to Watch in International Affairs'.

High Commendation

Iori Forsyth, Study Australia Partnership Manager, International Education Centre of Excellence, Austrade

Iori Forsyth is an early-career international education professional and University of the Sunshine Coast graduate, who has significant achievements recognised through her work in the sector including the Connecting Globally Award 2017 from the Queensland Department of Education for her leading role in establishing governmental partnerships between Queensland and Japan, and launching the state's first "Global STEM" educational study tour for Queensland.

Outstanding Postgraduate Thesis

Awardee

Dr Anna Kent, Sessional Academic and Researcher, Deakin University

Thesis: 'Australian scholarships for Papua New Guinea and the South Pacific: mandates and mis-steps, 1948 - 2018'.

Dr Anna Kent's PhD research is the first comprehensive history of Australian government scholarships to the Pacific. The thesis shifts the focus away from the Colombo Plan, which has traditionally been central to the Australian narrative of both international aid and international education history.

High Commendation

Dr Kazuhiro Kudo

Thesis: 'A three-stage ecological and person-in-context conceptual framework for understanding intercultural relationship development at university'

Dr Kazuhiro Kudo's thesis provides novel insights into an issue of major relevance in international education for more than four decades: promoting meaningful interactions between international and domestic students. This new insight is highly relevant for both researchers and practitioners keen to improve the quality of intercultural interactions and learning of all – international and domestic – students.

Helen Zimmerman, Chair, Tuition Protection Services Board, Department of Education

From her time as a young graduate teacher in pre-Cyclone Tracy Darwin, Helen has devoted her professional life to her twin educational passions of indigenous and international education. She has held numerous leadership positions in the sector, culminating in several senior executive roles at Navitas. A long-standing IEAA Board member and Vice President, Helen was also its first female President. Helen is currently the Chair of the Tuition Protection Services Board.
